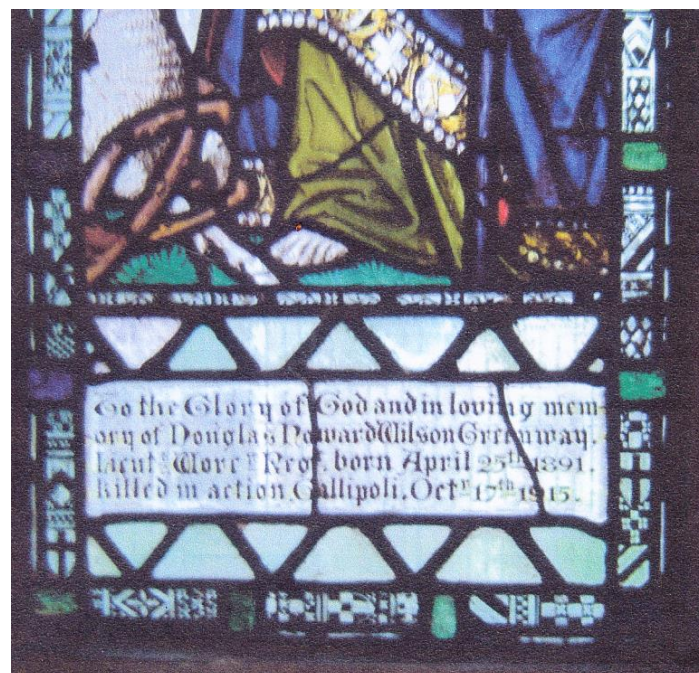
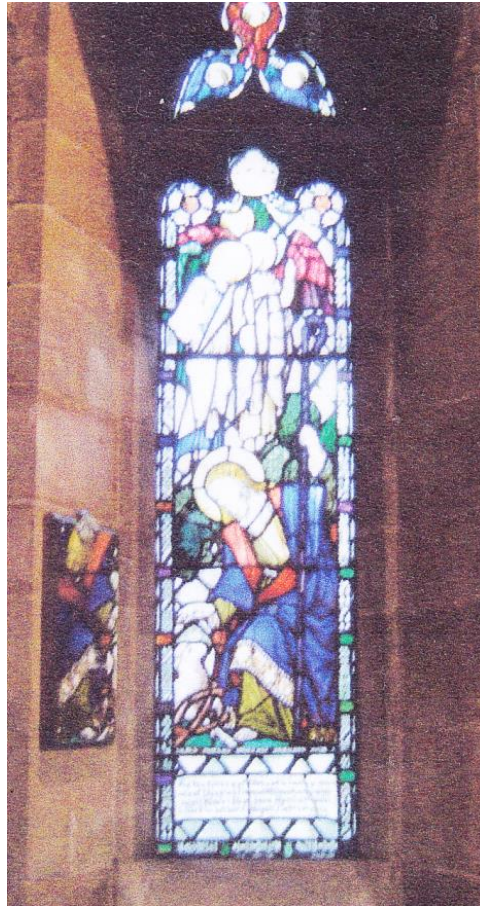

November 30th 1915

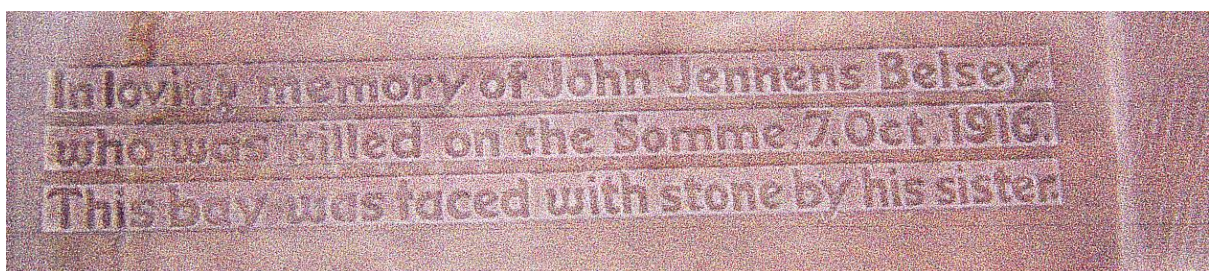
